Important Information Regarding Property Assessments

This may affect your 2026 property taxes.

The Board of Appeal and Equalization for the Township of Wrenshall will meet on 04/24/25, 1 P.M., at Wrenshall Town Hall. The purpose of this meeting is to determine whether property in the jurisdiction has been properly valued and classified by the assessor.

If you believe the value or classification of your property is incorrect, please contact your assessor's office to discuss your concerns. If you disagree with the value or classification after discussing it with your assessor, you may appear before the local board of appeal and equalization. The board will review your assessments and may make corrections as needed. Generally, you must appeal to the local board before appealing to the county board of appeal and equalization.

No complaint that another person is assessed too low will be acted upon until the person so assessed, or his agent, shall have been notified of such complaint.

City Minutes

WRENSHALL CITY COUNCIL
February 5, 2025, 6:00 p.m.
Regular Meeting

Attendance: Jeff Bloom, Duane Ziebarth, Kevin House, and Steve Studniski. Joyce Gvesrude attended the meeting via Zoom from Orange Beach, Alabama. Alieca Johnson, Mandie Resberg, Nathan Fiest, Pete Laveau, Mike Gravelle and ten (10) others. County Commissioner Sue Zmyslony was also in attendance. All voting at this meeting will be by roll call as one member is attending remotely.

Motion by; Studniski; seconded by House to approve the agenda as presented. Gvesrude-Yes; Ziebarth-Yes; House-Yes; Studniski-Yes; Bloom-Yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Ziebarth; seconded by Studniski to approve the Consent Agenda including minutes from the Regular Council Meeting on January 8, 2025, and checks as follows: Pre-pays-#31330- #31335 (#31336-#33151 Void) #31352-#31360=\$6,434.54; Payroll #31361-#31370=\$6,738.32; January bills #E11, #31371-#31383=\$12,953.24; and Electronic Transfers-01/15/25-1 & -2; ETR01/03/25 (E4-E8)=\$3,570.42. Gvesrude-Yes; Ziebarth-Yes; House-Yes; Studniski-Yes; Bloom-Yes. Motion carried.

Fire Chief: There were an unusually high number of calls in January; 20 medical/5 fire with most medicals going to the assisted living. Firefighter David Prylik was able to secure a \$4,000 grant from Enbridge that will be used for directional lights on #650. (A Benevity Account to receive these funds from Enbridge will need to be set up and David Prylik will function as the administrator.) The billing for fire protection sent to the city and townships for services in 2025 was received by the council. Motion by Gvesrude; seconded by Ziebarth to approve the start of the probationary period for Steve Schmidt. Gvesrude-Yes; Ziebarth-Yes; House-Yes; Studniski-Yes; Bloom-Yes. Motion carried. Wrenshall School will be discussing the weather evacuation plan and will contact the city when they are ready to move forward. Jeff Bloom attended the Carlton Ambulance meeting held earlier today.

Diane Hyry, Rob Hyry and Katie Beck-Wrenshall Community Education attended the meeting to indicate that they hope to work with the Brickyard Days Committee to plan the 2025 event. They have great enthusiasm and ideas and want to work with anyone and everyone to make the event a success.

Congratulations to Ruthie Kemp, the winner of the MRWA Fourth Grade Poster Contest and to Carina Luomanen and Angelina Knezevich who tied with honorable mentions. Thank you to Mrs. Suzy Berger and the Wrenshall Fourth Graders for taking part and for all the great entries.

Engineering: Nathan Feist gave an overview to the council of the PER and how this report is submitted to USDA to start the process to obtain grant funding for city projects. He further explained the bonding process and the scope of work for the Pioneer Project. Motion by Studniski; seconded by Bloom to increase the bonding request for Pioneer from \$2.3M to \$3M to include all sections from Broadway to County Road 1 and address sidewalks and other issues not previously considered. Gvesrude-No; Ziebarth-Yes; House-Yes; Studniski-Yes; Bloom-Yes. Motion carried. The clerk will contact Mike Bubany at David Drown & Associates for advice on the bonding process. Sue Zmyslony indicated that she would be willing to assist in any way.

Water Operator: Total Controls will be coming to inspect and repair the well alarm system that has been sending false codes. John will not be at the March meeting as he will be the Minnesota Rural Water Conference in St. Cloud.

Clerk: The new Assistant Clerk Mandie Resberg was introduced to the council. The bill card notice regarding snowmobiles/ATVs operating in the city park was read and approved. Adding an email bill module to Banyon utility billing software was discussed and will not be added at this time.

Maintenance: LED lights were installed on the plow truck and Northland will be coming to repair the snowblower.

Ponderosa Sales Conditional Use Permit: The clerk has spoken with the County Attorney's Office and this matter is on hold.

Bank Signers: Motion by Gvesrude; seconded by House to adopt Resolution 25-02 updating bank signers. Gvesrude-Yes; Ziebarth-Yes; House-Yes; Studniski-Yes; Bloom-Yes. Motion carried.

A Wrenshall Development Corporation meeting took place in January. Jeff Bloom, Kevin House, and Nathan Feist were in attendance. The PER and the bonding request were discussed as well as a donation to Brickyard Days.

Utility Repair Policy: Policies and information from Cloquet and Carlton were discussed. Motion by Studniski; seconded by Ziebarth to clarify the city code to reflect that residents will be responsible for water lines from their residence to the curb box and for sewer lines from their residence to the main. Any repairs that need to be made in city street need to be reported to the city and all repairs must be inspected and approved the City. Gvesrude-Yes; Ziebarth-Yes; House-No; Studniski-Yes; Bloom-Yes. Motion carried. Councilor House voted no as he felt that the city should be responsible for repairs in the city streets.
